**SGT. DAVID MEEKER**



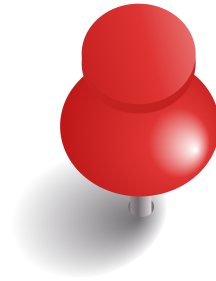
Sergeant David Meeker Jr. will retire in August 2026 following more than two decades of dedicated service in law enforcement.

The public hearings will remain open and will be closed after the City receives and reviews comments and recommendations from the Planning Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PCZBA) and the County Planning Department.

# DRI PROJECT UPDATES

## **Hotel Oneida Redevelopment**

Progress continues at the historic Hotel Oneida. Interior demolition is substantially complete, and construction materials—including new windows and railings—have been delivered and staged inside the building. Contractor bids have been received, financing details are being finalized, and all necessary permits remain active. City staff will be conducting a site walkthrough in June to review progress and discuss the next phase of redevelopment.

## **Downtown Business Assistance Fund**

Several downtown improvement projects continue to move forward:

✓ Completed: 134 Vanderbilt Avenue and 145 Madison Street

🚧 Under Construction: 117 Madison Street, 130 Broad Street, and 169 Main Street (All Seasonings, Inc.)

📝 In Development: 146 Madison Street project scope is being refined before bidding begins

✗ Withdrawn: 114 Vanderbilt Avenue due to contractor availability challenges

These projects represent ongoing private investment in Oneida's downtown business district.

## **Downtown Streetscape & Accessibility Improvements**

The City received encouraging news as requests for federal funding support were submitted through both Congressman John Mannion and Senator Kirsten Gillibrand's offices. Planning and coordination efforts continue to advance improvements aimed at enhancing downtown accessibility, pedestrian safety, and infrastructure while aligning with future transportation funding opportunities.

## **DRI & Long-Term Planning Efforts**

Work continues behind the scenes to administer Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) projects, secure reimbursements, and coordinate with state agencies. Efforts also remain underway on the City's Comprehensive Plan and Form-Based Code updates, helping guide future growth and redevelopment.

## **Devereaux Building Project**

The redevelopment focus has shifted solely to the historic Devereaux Building. The City continues working with the development team to establish an updated construction schedule and identify next project milestones.

## **Additional DRI Projects**

Planning and coordination continue for improvements at Veterans Memorial Park and the AYSO Soccer Fields, with ongoing efforts to identify funding opportunities and implementation strategies.

The City remains committed to advancing downtown revitalization, supporting local investment, and creating a vibrant, accessible community for residents, businesses, and visitors.

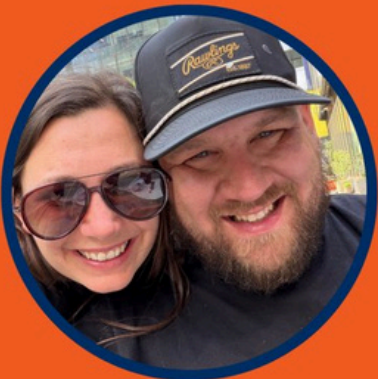


## Stephanie Waite

### **LEVEL PARENT CHILD – AGE 1 – 3+**

- WATER ACCLIMATION, WATER SAFETY, FLOATING & BREATHING SKILLS. IN-WATER PARENT/ADULT PARTICIPATION IS REQUIRED.

### **LEVEL PRE-SCHOOL – AGE 2 – 3+**

- WATER ACCLIMATION, SUBMERGING, GLIDES WITH ASSISTANCE, FLOATING & BREATHING SKILLS PROGRESSIONS, WATER SAFETY TOPICS

### **LEVEL 1 – INTRODUCTION TO WATER SKILLS – AGE: 3 – 4+**

- FOR THE BEGINNER WHO IS COMFORTABLE IN THE WATER, MUST BE WILLING TO GO UNDER WATER.
- SWIMMERS LEARN BASICS OF SWIMMING: BOBBING, GOING UNDER WATER, SUPPORTED FRONT AND BACK FLOATING, SUPPORTED ROLLING OVER FROM FRONT TO BACK AND BACK TO FRONT, SUPPORTED GLIDING, SUPPORTED FLUTTER KICK, SUPPORTED FRONT CRAWL ARMS AND JUMPING IN.

### **LEVEL 2 – FUNDAMENTAL AQUATIC SKILLS – AGE: 5+**

- SWIMMERS SHOULD ALREADY BE ABLE TO FLOAT ON FRONT AND BACK AND PUT THEIR HEADS UNDER WATER.
- SWIMMERS WILL WORK ON: INDEPENDENT FRONT AND BACK FLOATING, INDEPENDENT ROLLING OVER FROM FRONT TO BACK AND BACK TO FRONT, INDEPENDENT FRONT AND BACK GLIDES, FRONT CRAWL ARMS AND KICKS, BACK CRAWL ARMS AND KICKS, RETRIEVING UNDERWATER OBJECTS, AND JUMPING INTO WATER OVER THEIR HEAD.

### **LEVEL 3 – STROKE DEVELOPMENT – AGE: 5-6+**

- SWIMMERS SHOULD ALREADY BE COMFORTABLE SWIMMING FRONT STROKE AND SWIMMING ON THEIR BACK.
- SWIMMERS WILL WORK ON: GLIDING, FREESTYLE WITH SIDE BREATHING, BACKSTROKE, BREAST STROKE AND DOLPHIN KICKS, RETRIEVING OBJECTS IN DEEPER WATER, TREADING WATER, JUMPING INTO DEEP WATER AND COMPACT DIVES.

### **LEVEL 4 – STROKE IMPROVEMENT – AGES: 7-8+**

- SWIMMERS SHOULD ALREADY BE ABLE TO: SWIM FRONT AND BACK CRAWL 25 YARDS. • SWIMMERS WILL WORK ON: ROTARY BREATHING, FREESTYLE, BACKSTROKE, ELEMENTARY BACKSTROKE, SCISSORS KICK AND SIDESTROKE, WHIP KICK AND BREASTSTROKE, INTRO TO TURNING AT WALL, TREADING WATER WITH MODIFIED SCISSORS, AND DIVING IN KNEELING POSITION.

### **LEVEL 5 – STROKE REFINEMENT – AGES: 9-10+**

- SWIMMERS SHOULD ALREADY BE ABLE TO: SWIM FREESTYLE, BREASTSTROKE AND BACKSTROKE 25 YARDS, SCISSORS KICK, WHIP KICK, TREADING WATER, AND DIVE. • SWIMMERS WILL WORK ON: ALTERNATE BREATHING, STRIDE JUMP, REFINEMENT OF: FREESTYLE, BACKSTROKE, ELEMENTARY BACKSTROKE, SIDESTROKE, BREASTSTROKE, DOLPHIN KICK AND BUTTERFLY, OPEN TURN ON FRONT AND BACK, FEET-FIRST SURFACE DIVE, AND TREADING WATER.

### **LEVEL 6 – SWIMMING & SKILL PROFICIENCY – AGE: 11+**

- SWIMMERS SHOULD ALREADY BE ABLE TO: SWIM FRONT AND BACK CRAWL 50 YDS, ELEMENTARY BACKSTROKE 25 YARDS, BREASTSTROKE 25 YARDS, BUTTERFLY 25 YARDS, SIDESTROKE 10 YARDS, TREAD WATER FOR 3 MINUTES, AND DIVE.
  - SWIMMERS WILL WORK ON: ALL SIX STROKES, FRONT AND BACK CRAWL FLIP TURN, BREASTSTROKE TURN, BREASTSTROKE SPEED TURN AND PULLOUT, BUTTERFLY TURN, SIDESTROKE TURN, PIKE AND TUCK SURFACE DIVE, PIKE AND TUCK DIVE FROM BOARD, TREAD WATER FOR FIVE MINUTES, AND BASIC WATER RESCUE.

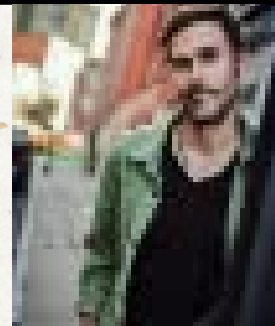
