# PROCLAMATION

# CITY OF ONEIDA, NEW YORK National Autism Awareness Day

**WHEREAS**, autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a complex developmental condition that affects an estimated 1 in 36 children in the United States, as well as countless adults, impacting communication, behavior, and social interactions; and

**WHEREAS**, individuals with autism are valuable members of our community, contributing their unique talents, perspectives, and strengths to our schools, workplaces, and society; and

**WHEREAS**, National Autism Awareness Day, recognized annually on April 2nd, provides an opportunity to increase understanding and acceptance of autism, promote early diagnosis and intervention, and support individuals and families affected by autism; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Oneida is committed to fostering an inclusive community where individuals with autism are respected, supported, and empowered to reach their full potential; and

**WHEREAS**, local organizations, educators, healthcare professionals, and advocates in Oneida work tirelessly to provide essential resources, services, and support for those living with autism and their families; and

**WHEREAS**, by raising awareness and promoting acceptance, we can break down barriers, celebrate neurodiversity, and create a more inclusive and supportive society for all.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, **Rick Rossi** Mayor of the City of Oneida, do hereby proclaim April 2, 2025, as **National Autism Awareness Day** in the City of Oneida and encourage all residents, businesses, and organizations to participate in activities and initiatives that promote understanding, acceptance, and support for individuals with autism and their families.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the City of Oneida to be affixed this **1st** of **April** 2025.

After the presentation of the proclamation by Mayor Rossi, Mr. Bailey announced that his family is bringing back an Autism Awareness Walk as their own individual fundraiser. The walk will be held on April 26th, and everyone is invited to join. All proceeds will benefit "Families First," a nonprofit organization that supports families with special needs.

The city is co-sponsoring the event, which will begin at Higinbotham Park, head to the Oneida Library, and return. It will run from 10 a.m. to noon. Jenn Bailey expressed appreciation for the library, noting that they've been wonderful to work with—they'll be offering sensory spaces and sharing information to raise autism awareness.

# **PRESENTATION:**BRiDGES (Impact of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs on our community)Heather Bernet, Valarie Webb, and Samantha Dartt

Heather Bernet began by thanking the Mayor, City Manager, and Council for permitting them to speak. She stated that their purpose in attending was to introduce their organization and highlight the services they offer. She affirmed their commitment to supporting the City of Oneida by equipping residents with the knowledge and resources needed to make informed decisions regarding their health and overall wellbeing.

She shared that she is the Statewide Administrative Coordinator for Advancing Tobacco-Free Communities, a grant funded by the NYS Department of Health's Bureau of Tobacco Control. She noted that Bridges has held the grant since 2001 and expressed pride in having worked on the program for 25 years.

Ms. Bernet explained that the focus of the presentation was to highlight their work in commercial tobacco control and prevention. She clarified that their efforts specifically address commercial, addictive tobacco products—not the traditional tobacco considered sacred and used in ceremonies, prayers, and healing practices—emphasizing the importance of that distinction. She noted that smoking remains the leading cause of preventable death and disease in the country, with the average age of a new smoker being just 13. Many communities, including Oneida, have adopted smoke-free policies in parks and playgrounds. She added that their collaboration with communities has contributed to creating healthier environments in which to live, work, learn, and play.

She introduced her colleagues, Valarie Webb and Samantha (Sam) Dartt, who each spoke about their roles in the program. Val works directly with youth, empowering them to use their voices to educate peers and community members about the deceptive marketing tactics used by the tobacco industry. She shared that they strive to develop creative approaches to raise awareness within the community.

Sam stated that she serves as the Tobacco Control Specialist with the Bridges Tobacco Control Program. In this role, she is responsible for building partnerships and acting as a liaison between schools, employers, organizations, state and local health departments, and community members. She explained that their work focuses on three key initiatives: reducing tobacco marketing in the retail environment, promoting smoke-free housing, and supporting tobacco-free outdoor spaces for both employers and public areas.

Ms. Bernet concluded the presentation by distributing resource materials and noting that their organization offers a wealth of information for municipalities interested in implementing effective tobacco-related policies. She clarified that while Bridges does not and cannot engage in lobbying, they are

able to connect communities with resources to support informed decision-making. She added that the NYS Department of Health offers a wealth of information for municipalities who desire to implement effective tobacco related policies.
