Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance/Roll Call

PUBLIC COMMENT

AARON BROWKA (5282 Brookfield Rd., Lee Center, NY 13363)

Mr. Browka read a prepared letter to encourage the Council and the Mayor to opt out of retail cannabis sales for the City of Oneida, stating that he was concerned about the sale of marijuana for four reasons:

- 1. He is concerned that the first licenses will be given to people who have had prior convictions regarding marijuana when it was illegal, commenting that the State should not give preference to people who previously showed disregard for the law.
- 2. Concern over marijuana use among teenagers and young adults- as a public-school teacher, he stated that he is concerned over the message that is sent to students when the governments promote and benefit from marijuana sales. He believes that one of the purposes of government is to promote the general welfare and not to promote the use of a gateway drug. He stated that teenagers that are of high school age are impressionable, and adults should set a good example by not encouraging the use of marijuana.
- 3. Concern over people driving under the influence of marijuana, stating that marijuana impacts the ability to operate motor vehicles and puts other people in danger
- 4. Concern about property values near marijuana dispensaries and consumption establishments, citing a recent study from the State of Washington, whereby sale prices of homes within 36 hundredths of a mile decreased by 3-4%.

He concluded by saying that the City of Oneida offers many opportunities for individuals for businesses and community establishments and wants to keep Oneida a positive place for people to work and live.

Supervisor Matt Roberts provided an update stating that sales tax revenue continues to trend at 15-20% above 2021, which is great for the citizens of Madison County. He also noted that the Rural Broadband Project was moving forward and is expected to be completed within 2 years. He advised that the City needs to stay close to the County with the project, as it will be a great lever to bring investment, businesses and residents to the City.

Supervisor Mary Cavanagh provided an update through email to the City Clerk advising that the County recognized "Public Health Week" at the last Board meeting and praised their public health employees for all their hard work over the past 2 years, stating that they could not thank them enough for everything they have done and for going above and beyond during the pandemic.

ADOPT LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 139 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ONEIDA TO ALLOW FOR THE UPDATING OF SEWAGE DISPOSAL CHARGES

RESOLUTION 22-62

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law, a proposed local law titled "A Local Law to Amend Chapter 139 of the Code of the City of Oneida to Allow for the Updating of Sewage Disposal Charges" was presented and introduced at a Regular Meeting of the Common Council of the City of Oneida held on March 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on such proposed local law on April 5, 2022 and by the Common Council of the City of Oneida and proof of publication of notice of such public hearing, as required by law, having been submitted and filed, and all persons desiring to be heard in connection with said proposed local law having been heard, and said proposed local law having been in the possession of the members of the Common Council of the City of Oneida in its final form in the manner required by Section 20 of the Municipal Home Rule of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the enactment of the Proposed Local Law has previously been determined to be an unlisted action for purposes of environmental review under SEQRA, an environmental impact statement (EIS) was not required, and a negative declaration was issued on March 15, 2022 pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQR) determining that this action will have no significant effect on the environment thus concluding the SEQR review process; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to enact said Proposed Local Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

RESOLVED that the Common Council of the City of Oneida, Madison County, New York, does hereby enact Local Law No. 4 of 2022 as follows:

"A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 139 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ONEIDA TO ALLOW FOR THE UPDATING OF SEWAGE DISPOSAL CHARGES

Be it enacted by the Common Council of the City of Oneida, that this local law amends Chapter 139 of the Code of the City of Oneida, as follows:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY.

This local law is enacted pursuant to the New York State Constitution and New York Municipal Home Rule Law § 10.

SECTION 2.

So that Section 139-8(A)(1) of the City of Oneida Code is hereby amended to read in its entirety, as follows:

"The sewage disposal charges, for other than significant industrial uses, to be paid by the owner, tenant or occupant of each lot of parcel which may be connected with or may use the sewage disposal system and to whom a bill shall be rendered for water furnished by the Water Department of the City of Oneida or whose sewage is otherwise metered or measured, shall be in accordance with such a rate as may be

established from time to time by resolution of the Common Council. A sewage meter shall be installed at the request of either the consumer or the City Engineer's office, the expense thereof to be borne by the consumer."

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Local Law shall be effective upon filing with the office of the Secretary of State."
