REDUCED RATE REQUEST FOR USE OF THE KALLET CIVIC CENTER

WHEREAS, Refuge Ministries, a not-for-profit, with a mailing address of P.O. Box 103, Wampsville, NY 13163 submitted to the Parks and Recreation Department a Lease Agreement for use of the Kallet Civic Center from November 16, 2022 to November 19, 2022 for the purpose of holding their House of Hope Festival of Trees event; and

WHEREAS, Refuge Ministries desires for this to be an annual event with the City of Oneida and to build a relationship with the City to expand and build upon this Festival of Trees event; and

WHEREAS, the current Rate Schedule for not-for profits leasing the Kallet Civic Center for the stated dates are as follows:

November 16, 2022 \$45 per hour November 17, 2022 \$65 per hour November 18-19, 2022 \$85 per hour, **and**

WHEREAS, Refuge Ministries is requesting a reduction in the hourly rate for November 17, November 18 and November 19, 2022 to \$45 per hour; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Common Council hereby agrees to reduce the current rate of \$65 per hour for November 17, 2022 to \$45 per hour and to reduce the current rate of \$85 per hour for November 18-19 to \$45 per hour.

SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING PER ONEIDA CITY CODE CHAPTER 34, ARTICLE III, UNSAFE BULDINGS AND COLLAPSED STRUCTURES

RESOLVED, that the Report of Unsafe Structures, as per Oneida City Code Chapter 34, Article III, Unsafe Buildings and Collapsed Structures, from Brian B. Burkle Jr., Fire Marshal, for property located at 140 Madison Street in the City of Oneida (Tax Map No. 30.72-1-66) is hereby received and placed on file, **and be it further**

RESOLVED, that a Public Hearing be scheduled for Tuesday, June 7, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. in the Common Council Chambers, 109 N. Main Street, Oneida NY 13421 to afford the Common Council the opportunity to issue an order deeming the property to be a "Public Nuisance" and to order corrective action be taken on 140 Madison Street, Oneida, NY.

DISCUSSION:

City Attorney Bell explained the process of deeming a property to be a "Public Nuisance" and to order corrective action to be taken on the property for the benefit of Councilors who are new, stating that it is governed by Chapter 34 of the City Code. She advised that when the Fire Marshal finds a property that he deems to be unsafe within the definition of the Code, he prepares a report. This report is circulated to the Mayor and Council. A Public Hearing is then scheduled for anyone with an interest in the property to come and make any arguments as to why they feel the Fire Marshal has rendered this determination in error. Under the Code, there is an obligation for the City to put the property owner and any party with an interest in the property on notice.

The City Attorney will then prepare a Notice of Unsafe Structure which will be based on the report prepared by the Fire Marshal.

She advised that her office has already reached out to a title company to obtain a last owner search so that any entity with an interest in the property will also receive notice. The Unsafe Notice will then be filed with the County Clerk's office, which is much like a *Lis pendens*, similar to that which is filed with a bankruptcy, and will become part of the title.

All interested parties are then served by Certified Mail and are provided an opportunity to appear at the Public Hearing, noting that the date selected for this instance was to allow enough time for the title company search to come back.

LEASE AGREEMENT-ENTERPRISE FLEET MANAGEMENT
