WHEREAS, the Oneida High School's 2021 Girls Varsity Tennis Team consists of 15 members, including 6 Seniors who began playing in 7th grade, 2 Juniors, 4 Sophomores, 2 Freshman and 1 Spanish Exchange Student, **and**

WHEREAS, under the direction of Coach Todd Hicks, whose record is 331-45 and who started as a JV Coach in 1998 and took over Varsity in 2002, hold an undefeated championship record of 18-0 that led them to the New York State Semifinals, and

WHEREAS, JV Coach Chris Meeker, who started coaching in 1998, was also very influential in the success of the team, and

WHEREAS, the team began preparing in the Spring for the New York State Semifinals by playing competitively, taking lessons, and practicing with the Boy's Tennis Team, which significantly contributed to their Fall success, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Girls' Tennis Team was honored to play in their first-ever New York State Girls Tennis Team Championship that began on November 5, 2021 at the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing, one of the world's largest public tennis facilities, and

WHEREAS, the City of Oneida and its residents are proud of the dedication and success of the Oneida High School's 2021 Girls Varsity Tennis Team and wish them the very best in their future endeavors, especially the seniors, who will be leaving Oneida High School as Champions.

Prior to starting the meeting, the Mayor advised that there were 2 great, exciting things that happened for the City that she wanted to share:

- 1. Mayor Acker thanked Chief John Little from the Oneida Police Department and Assistant Chief Steve Lowell, who is a "terrific" grant writer, for his efforts in securing a \$150,000 grant from the Department of Justice. This initiative was awarded to rural law enforcement communities to help fight violent crime. The focus of the project is two prong- 1.) enforcement and engagement and 2.) improve environmental design to reduce crime in the City. Assistant Chief Lowell received a round of applause for his hard work and dedication.
- 2. The Mayor advised that through the efforts of the City's Planning Department, Cassie Rose and Barb Henderson-who were the main people who put the Grant together, the City was awarded \$10M from New York State for the Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI). She stated that she had just recently been notified and was unable to share the news until today (December 7). It was noted that this was the second attempt to get this award, with the first being 2 years ago. She also acknowledged the DRI Committee members who helped make this possible:

A round of applause was given, with the Mayor commenting that it was nice to receive a grant that we didn't need to match. The Mayor advised that although the City was awarded the grant, it is still a process, and the money would not be available right away. The State will send representatives to the City to meet with the Committee and fine tune things. They then will ultimately determine if all projects will be approved or if changes need to be made. She noted that there were 13 things that the City was looking to do that were included in the DRI application:

- 1. Revitalize Hotel Oneida
- 2. Historic Kallet Theatre Repairs & Renovations, Façade Repairs and apply to become a Level 1 NYS Qualified Production Facility (QPF)
- 3. Farm to Table Restaurant and Micro Brewery-5 story Devereaux Building Rehabilitation and upper floor Artist housing
- 4. Oneida Performance Pavilion
- 5. Dispatch Commons

- 6. Downtown Arts and Culture District Initiative to include: Arts & Culture Center, Spark Main Street Program, Historic Downtown Oneida Branding & Marketing Program, and establishing a list of local filming sites
- 7. Infrastructure Improvements for Historic Downtown area
- 8. 126-132 North Main Street and 134-138 South Main Street Historic Building Upgrades
- 9. Downtown Business Program
- 10. Downtown Murals Program
- 11. Enhanced Annual Arts & Entertainment Festivals-Mobile Stage, Screens, Sound System and Trailer for use in Clinch Park, Carinci Park and other Downtown Venues
- 12. AYSO Soccer Complex
- 13. Downtown City Park Upgrades

Councilor Earl also wanted to acknowledge and thank the people that are building businesses in the City already. There was discussion about the existing businesses, citing an example of Hotel Oneida and how the owner, Bob Sullivan, is part of the Committee. He is also looking at other options as well to help fund renovations.

RESOLVED, that agreeable to the estimates of the expenses and disbursements for the year 2022 constituting the budget, including Capital Plan, for the City of Oneida, the same is hereby approved by the Common Council on the seventh day of December, 2021 as set forth in the minutes of this meeting; there shall be levied and raised on the taxable property of the entire city, not including pension, pastor and over sixty-five (65) exempt property as follows:

Total Gross Budget \$ 25,935,488

Less estimated revenues \$ 23,233,429

Taxable balance \$ 5,096,110

Of which, \$2,687,005 shall be levied on the entire city establishing a tax rate of \$5.53456 per thousand and \$1,831,695 shall be levied on the corporation tax district at a rate of \$5.41237 per thousand; thereby establishing a combined rate of \$10.94693 per thousand inside tax district; and be it further

RESOLVED, that \$546,526 shall be levied and a rate of \$4.15395 per thousand shall be established for the outside fire district, **and be it further**

RESOLVED, that \$30,884 shall be levied and a rate of \$0.071789 per thousand shall be established for hydrant tax, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the total tax levy for the City of Oneida 2021 budget is \$5,096,110.
