BOND RESOLUTION-DRI CAPITAL PROJECTS

RESOLUTION 24-7

Moved by Councilor Hitchings Seconded by Councilor Winchell

> A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING DESIGN COSTS IN CONNECTION WITH VARIOUS DRI CAPITAL PROJECTS, IN AND FOR THE CITY OF ONEIDA, MADISON COUNTY, NEW YORK, AT A MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST OF \$700,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$700,000 BONDS OF SAID CITY TO PAY COSTS THEREOF.

BE IT RESOLVED by the affirmative vote of not less than two thirds of the total voting strength of

the Common Council of the City of Oneida, Madison County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. Design costs in connection with various DRI capital projects, in and for the City of

Oneida, Madison County, New York, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$700,000.

Section 2. The plan for the financing of such maximum estimated cost is by the issuance of

\$700,000 bonds of said City hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the

Local Finance Law; provided, however, that the amount of bonds to be issued shall be reduced to the

extent of grants received in connection therewith.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid

class of objects or purposes is five years, pursuant to subdivision 62 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said City of Oneida, Madison County, New York, are hereby

irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent not paid from other sources, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said City, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the City Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said City Comptroller, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 6.</u> All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the City Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of such City. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the City Comptroller shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said City is not authorized to expend money, or
- The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

<u>Section 8.</u> This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

<u>Section 9.</u> This resolution, which takes effect immediately upon the final passage thereof, shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said City for such purpose, together with a notice of the City Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

DISCUSSION: Councilor Laureti asked if the \$700,000 was reimbursable by the Grant. Comptroller Wells advised that the soccer fields would be; however, regarding Vet's Field and the Downtown Infrastructure and Streetscape Improvements, the City has a commitment to make additional payment more than the DRI award. Comptroller Wells advised that she has not yet received an answer as to whether the design portion is reimbursable or not.

Councilor Laureti asked where the \$700,000 figure came from, to which Comptroller Wells advised that the figure represents the full 100% design cost for the three projects noted in the next resolution.
