4. AGREEMENT-GREATER ONEIDA LITTLE LEAGUE INC.

RESOLVED, to authorize the Mayor to sign an Agreement with Greater Oneida Little League Inc., a not-for-profit corporation, for the use of a parcel located to the immediate north of and contiguous to Maxwell Field, designated as SBL # 38.34-1-1, owned by the City of Oneida, to grant a license to enter upon and use said parcel for the purpose of conducting its Little League and City-assumed functions for City and area residents, for a term to extend to December 31, 2032.

LICENSE

License between the City of Oneida, a municipal corporation, located in the County of Madison, New York, acting through its Youth Bureau and Recreation Department (hereinafter referred to as "City"), and Greater Oneida Little League Inc., a not-for-profit corporation with an office situated in the City of Oneida, New York (hereinafter referred to as "Little League").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City is the owner of certain land in the City of Oneida designated as S.B.L.# 38.34-1-1 located to the immediate north of and contiguous to Maxwell Field (hereinafter referred to as "Parcel"), also owned by the City; and

WHEREAS, Little League is desirous of retaining an accessible site for Little League baseball for the benefit of City and area youth generally; and

WHEREAS, after operating a program which took in children who had participated in the City Bronco and Pony baseball programs under the general supervision of the City, Little League began operating the current Little League Program on the Parcel in 1992; and

WHEREAS, since 1992, Little League has operated the Little League Program on the Parcel and assumed responsibility for maintaining the Parcel as a suitable recreation site; and

WHEREAS, the parties are willing to renew its arrangement for the continued use of the Parcel by Little League consistent with the mutual interests of both parties,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the total sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) paid by Little League to the City, and other good and valuable consideration, receipt whereof is acknowledged, the parties do agree and covenant as follows:

- 1. The City hereby grants to Little League a license to enter upon and use the said parcel designated as S.B.L.# 38.34-1-1 solely for the purpose of conducting its Little League and City-assumed functions for City and area residents. Little League shall abide by all applicable provisions of law in its use of the Parcel, including but not limited to those pertaining to flood plain/flood hazard control and construction of improvements.
- 2. Little League shall be solely responsible for the work and expense involved in maintaining the Parcel, for all improvements desired by it, and for all maintenance of such improvements. Little League covenants it shall maintain the grounds and all improvements in good repair and condition during the term of this License and any renewal(s). All improvements made or constructed shall be deemed in all respects as property of the City and shall remain with the Parcel after termination hereof.
- 3. The term of this License shall extend to December 31, 2032. Unless terminated as herein provided, the License shall be automatically renewed for a term of ten (10) years thereafter unless either party shall give written notice to the other at least 180 days prior to the end of the term of its election not to renew.
- 4. This License shall not be deemed to create a lease arrangement, an easement, or any estate or interest in land. This License may not be assigned or conveyed by Little League. Neither this License nor the exercise thereof shall be deemed to create an agency relationship between the parties. Notwithstanding any other provision herein, failing adequate maintenance of the Parcel and improvements by Little League as above stated, the City may forthwith cancel this

License and maintain the Parcel as it may deem advisable. Notwithstanding this License, the City may enter upon the Parcel as it deems appropriate or necessary but not so as to interfere with Little League's use of the premises. The City agrees not to convey a license for use of substantially the same parcel to any other party during the term hereof and any renewal(s).

- 5. As an express condition of the acceptance of this License and the use thereof by Little League, Little League covenants that it shall and hereby does release, indemnify and hold harmless the City from any and all liability to person or property asserted against the City and/or Little League by reason of any act or omission of Little League, its agents, guests, participants, employees or contractors arising in connection with use of this License or of the Parcel and improvements. Little League shall provide to the City upon signing of this License and annually thereafter on the anniversary of this License (or at other agreed times), certificates of insurance acceptable to the City, naming City as an additional insured with at least 30 days notice of cancellation/non-renewal, and indemnifying the City in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 for bodily injury and property damage on an occurrence basis. Little League acknowledges that it has inspected the Parcel and assumes all risks occasioned by use thereof.
- 6. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the City retains the right, after written notice to Little League, to immediately terminate this License if it shall in its absolute discretion deem the use made of the Parcel or improvements by Little League, its agents, guests, etc., to be detrimental to the public's safety, health, or welfare.
- 7. Little League shall be solely responsible for matters pertaining to the advertisement and publication of notices, if any, permitted by Little League, and shall indemnify and hold harmless the City from any claims arising in connection therewith.

8. This License is intended to supersede and replace the previously executed license agreement between the parties. This agreement contains all of the terms of the agreement between the parties and may be modified only by further written instrument.

CITY OF ONEIDA PROPOSED LOCAL LAW 2023

A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 165 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ONEIDA TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE
X, TITLED "SOLAR AND WIND ENERGY
SYSTEMS; FARM WASTE ENERGY SYSTEMS," PURSUANT TO
REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW § 487

Be it enacted by the Common Council of the City of Oneida, as follows:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT

It is the intent of the Common Council of the City of Oneida to opt-out of the real property tax exemption for wind and solar energy systems and farm waste energy systems within the jurisdiction and geographic boundaries of the City of Oneida. The City has received applications for solar and wind energy systems and farm waste energy systems to be located within the City and additional applications are anticipated in the future. These systems are eligible for a real property tax exemption under New York State Real Property Tax Law which would otherwise eliminate real property tax revenue generated for the City from these systems. New York State Real Property Tax Law authorizes municipalities to opt-out of the real property tax exemption for solar, wind systems and farm waste energy systems provided the municipality enacts a local law "opting out" of the tax exemption. In accordance with Real Property Tax Law § 487, it is the intent of this Local Law that the City of Oneida opt-out of the real property tax exemption for solar and wind energy systems and farm waste energy systems.

SECTION 2. AUTHORITY

This Local Law is enacted pursuant to New York Real Property Tax Law § 487(8), the New York State Constitution, and New York Municipal Home Rule Law §10.

SECTION 3.

Chapter 165 of the Code of the City of Oneida is amended to add a new Article X thereto, as follows:

"Article X

Solar and Wind Energy Systems; Farm Waste Energy Systems

§ 165-23 Opt-out of real property tax exemption.

Pursuant to and consistent with New York State Real Property Tax Law § 487(8) the City of Oneida Common Council hereby declares that solar and wind energy systems and farm waste energy systems shall not be exempt from real property taxes within the jurisdiction and geographic boundaries of the City of Oneida."

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

SECTION 5. FILING

Pursuant to New York Real Property Tax Law § 487(8), following the enactment of this Local Law a copy of this Local Law shall be filed with the Commissioner of the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance and the President of the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA).

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall be effective upon filing with the office of the Secretary of State.
