WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law, a proposed Local Law, titled "A Local Law Amending the Annual Income Ranges for Senior Citizens as set forth in Chapter 165 of the Oneida City Code and Creating a Cold War Veterans Exemption" was presented and introduced at a Regular Meeting of the Common Council of the City of Oneida held on October 1, 2024; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on such proposed Local Law on October 15, 2024, by the Common Council of the City of Oneida and proofs of publication of notices of such public hearings, as required by law, having been submitted and filed, and all persons desiring to be heard in connection with said proposed local law having been heard, and said proposed Local Law having been in the possession of the members of the Common Council of the City of Oneida in its final form in the manner required by Section 20 of the Municipal Home Rule of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the enactment of the Proposed Local Law has previously been determined to be a Type II action and will have no significant effect on the environment, thus concluding the environmental review process; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to enact said Proposed Local Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

RESOLVED, that the Common Council of the City of Oneida, Madison County, New York, does hereby enact a Local Law of 2024 as follows:

"LOCAL LAW 2024

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE ANNUAL INCOME RANGES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS AS SET FORTH IN CHAPTER 165 OF THE ONEIDA CITY CODE AND CREATING A COLD WAR VETERANS EXEMPTION

Be it enacted by the Common Council of the City of Oneida, as follows:

Section 1.

So that the annual income ranges for persons 65 years of age or over as listed in Section 165-2 of the Oneida City Code, titled "Conditions for exemption," Subsection A(1), shall be revised, in its entirety as follows:

"No exemption shall be granted:

A. If the income of the owner or the combined income of the owners of the property for the income tax year immediately preceding the date of making application for exemption exceeds the sum of \$37,000.00.

(1) Income in a lesser amount, subject to the provisions of this article, shall entitle owner or owners to an exemption according to the following schedule:

Annual Income	Percentage Assessed Valuation Exempt from Taxation
\$29,000 and less	50%
\$29,001 - \$30,000	45%
\$30,001 - \$31,000	40%
\$31,001 - \$32,000	35%
\$32,001 - \$33,000	30%
\$33,001 - \$34,000	25%
\$34,001 - \$35,000	20%
\$35,001 - \$36,000	15%
\$36,001 - \$37,000	10%"

Section 2.

So that the title of Article VI of Chapter 165 is hereby amended to read "Article VI Veteran Exemptions," and Subsection A of Section 165-14 is hereby amended in its entirety, so as to read as follows:

"A. Exemptions.

- 1. An Alternative Veteran's exemption is hereby provided for and ordained on real property taxes in the City of Oneida pursuant to § 458-a of the Real Property Tax Law, but subject to the qualifications, limitations and application procedures stated in said section.
- 2. A Cold War Veteran's exemption is hereby provided for and ordained on real property taxes in the City of Oneida pursuant to § 458-b of the Real Property Tax Law, but subject to the qualifications, limitations and application procedures stated in said section."

Section 3. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York, as provided in Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law."

3. INTRODUCE A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING A PROPERTY TAX LEVY IN EXCESS OF THE LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW §3-C-SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING

WHEREAS, no other agency has the legal authority or jurisdiction to approve or directly undertake the enactment of a local law in the City of Oneida, such that there are no other involved agencies within the meaning of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQR) with respect to the proposed enactment of said Local Law, with the result that the Common Council shall act as lead agency in this matter; and

WHEREAS, the adoption to said Local Law is an unlisted action for purposes of environmental review under SEQR; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council has determined that a short environmental assessment form (EAF) shall be required in connection with this matter; and

WHEREAS, the said EAF has been prepared and has been reviewed by the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council has considered the adoption of said Local Law, has considered the criteria contained in 6 N.Y.C.R.R. Part 617.7 and has compared the impacts which may be reasonably expected to result from the adoption of said Local Law against said criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED that the enactment of proposed Local Law is an unlisted action, there are no other involved agencies, and this Council shall act as lead agency in this matter for purposes of SEQR review; and it is further

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED the Common Council has determined this action shall have no significant adverse impact on the environment; that, accordingly, an environmental impact statement (EIS) shall not be required; and that this resolution shall constitute a negative declaration under SEQR; and it is further

RESOLVED, that a proposed Local Law authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the limit established in General Municipal Law §3-C be hereby received and placed on file as follows:

CITY OF ONEIDA PROPOSED LOCAL LAW

A LOCAL LAW OVERRIDING THE TAX LEVY LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW §3-C IN THE CITY OF ONEIDA

Section 1. Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to allow the City of Oneida to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2025, that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law § 3-c.

Section 2. Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes a local government's governing body to override the property tax cap for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of said governing body.

Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override

If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court's order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. Effective date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a Public Hearing on the proposed Local Law authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the limit established in General Municipal Law §3-C be scheduled for Tuesday, November 19, 2024, at 6:30 pm.

Madison County Interoperable Communications System Agreement

The parties to this Agreement shall be the Madison County, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, by John M. Becker, its County Chairman of the Board (hereinafter "County") with its principal offices located at 138 N Court Street, Wampsville NY, 13163, and the City of Oneida (hereinafter "User"), with its principal offices located at 109 North Main Street, Oneida, NY 13421.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Madison County operates an Interoperable Communications System, which is managed by the Office of Emergency Management, headed by the Director of Emergency Management, who, among other things, is responsible for administering the operation of a county-wide emergency communications center; and

WHEREAS, the Madison County Interoperable Communications System (hereinafter "MCICS") is an integrated system of equipment and facilities necessary for the provision of county-wide emergency communication services; and

WHEREAS, to provide for the safety and protection of the public and public safety responders, and to maintain the integrity of the MCICS, it is necessary to establish procedures for the use of the MCICS;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the benefits conferred and obligations incurred herein, the parties do mutually agree as follows:

- 1. PURPOSE: The MCICS is a system for providing emergency communication services, coordinated and operated by the County, which system includes, but is not limited to, communication towers, base stations, antennas, system controllers, equipment shelters, system frequencies, subscriber radio equipment, and other equipment necessary to facilitate emergency communications. The County hereby grants User access to the MCICS for the purpose of providing emergency and/or municipal communication services, subject to the terms of this Agreement.

3. OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES:

3.1 OWNERSHIP AND USE OF RADIO EQUIPMENT: The County hereby grants to User the rights to use, and operate the radio equipment listed on Attachment A (hereinafter "County-assigned equipment"), attached hereto and made a part hereof. The County shall own such equipment for a period of twenty years from the date of purchase and upon the expiration of said twenty year period; ownership can be transfer to User at fair market value.

User agrees not to sell or transfer such equipment without prior approval of the Director of Emergency Management during the period of ownership. User agrees to replace any lost equipment at User's expense. User agrees to replace any equipment damaged in excess of normal wear and tear at User's expense. Replacement items must meet specifications approved by the Director of Emergency Management or his/her representative.

3.2 OWNERSHIP AND USE OF DATA EQUIPMENT: The County hereby grants to User the rights to use, and operate the data connection equipment listed on Attachment B (hereinafter "County-provided data equipment"), attached hereto and made a part hereof. User understands that County-provided Date Equipment is being provided to the User one time only and that the County shall own such equipment throughout its useful life. At the end of useful life, equipment shall be returned to the County for proper disposal and User is responsible to replace equipment.

User agrees not to sell or transfer such equipment without prior approval of the Director of Emergency Management during the period of ownership. User agrees to replace any lost equipment at User's expense. User agrees to replace any equipment damaged in excess of normal wear and tear at User's expense.

- 3.3 <u>INSTALLATION OF EQUIPMENT:</u> User agrees to install County-assigned mobile radio equipment and/or County-provided data equipment into User vehicles at User's cost and only use said equipment for the expressed purpose of carrying out emergency service operations.
- 3.4 FAILURE TO USE EQUIPMENT: If for any reason, User fails to use any County-assigned or County-provided equipment, User shall notify the County Director of Emergency Management, or his/her representative and, if requested, shall return such equipment to the County in working order within 30 days of the request.
- 3.5 HOLD HARMLESS: To the fullest extent permitted by law, the User shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Madison County, its representatives, agents, servants, employees, officers, departments and authorities, from and against all claims, injuries, demands, judgments, settlements, damages, losses, liabilities, costs and expenses of any kind or nature, including but not limited to litigation costs and attorney's fees, whether arising in law or in equity, all without any limitation whatsoever, arising out of or resulting from the User's performance of the work and/or duties and/or the transactions

contemplated by this agreement and which are caused, in whole or in part, by or because of any act or omission of the User, directly or indirectly, and/or by the User's agents, servants, employees, subcontractors and/or any person or entity employed by User or for whose conduct or action the User may be found or held liable, directly or indirectly. In the event that the County is determined to be any percent negligent pursuant to any verdict or judgement, then the User's obligation to indemnify the County for any amount, payment, judgement, settlement, mediation or arbitration award shall extend only to the percentage of negligence of the User or anyone directly or indirectly engaged or retained by it and anyone else for whose acts the contractor is liable. It is the intention of the parties that the right and entitlement to a defense; the right and entitlement to be held harmless; and the right and entitlement to indemnification shall be as broad as permitted under applicable law. Further, the User agrees to indemnify the County in like regard in an action upon the contract between the parties and claims between the parties, including counsel fees and litigation costs and expenses. The terms of this agreement shall not be construed to negate, abridge or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of contribution or indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any party or person subject to this agreement. This agreement and paragraph shall be liberally construed so as to afford the County the fullest possible protection and indemnity. In the event that User shall fail or refuse to defend, hold harmless and/or indemnify the County against any such claim, loss, damage, judgment, settlement or action, User shall be liable to the County for all expense, expenditure and cost incurred or to be incurred by the County in defending, resolving and/or satisfying any such claim, loss, damage, judgment, settlement or action, together with all cost and expense of the County, including all attorney's fees, incurred in the County pursuing claim or suit or action against or recovering fees costs and expense from User.

3.6 PAYMENT: The County has contractual obligations associated with the purchase of the County-assigned equipment. As such, the County agrees to provide the use of County-assigned radio equipment listed on Attachment A to User without charge therefore.

County-provided data equipment includes a cellular connectivity card and a mobile license for access to the County's Computer-aided Dispatch (CAD) program. The County agrees to provide mobile license access at no cost to the User. Upon invoice from the County, User agrees to reimburse the County for cellular connectivity costs at the rate that the County is being charged by the cellular provider. Said invoices to be sent-biannually. NOTE: The City of Oneida will provide SIM cards at their expense.

3.7 EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE: User is responsible for the operational integrity and compatibility of all County-assigned equipment, County-provided data equipment, and any User-owned subscriber equipment (i.e. portables, mobiles, vehicular repeaters, and control stations, intercoms, headsets and all other related peripheral accessories) that interfaces with the MCICS.

With respect to County-assigned equipment, Madison County will maintain all such equipment to ensure equipment is in proper working order in accordance to manufacturer

and MCICS specifications and cause all replacements, hardware or software upgrades or modifications, and repairs to be timely made. User will notify the Director of Emergency Management, or his/her representative of any equipment "off line" and in need of repair. This provision does not apply to wear items, such as but not limited to batteries, antennas, and speaker microphones. User shall, at its own expense, maintain and replace wear items as necessary. Replacement items must meet specifications approved by the Director of Emergency Management or his/her representative.

With respect to County-provided data equipment, User will maintain all such equipment to ensure equipment is in proper working order in accordance to manufacturer and MCICS specifications and cause all replacements, hardware or software upgrades or modifications, and repairs to be timely made. Any malfunctions/issues regarding the proper working order of any equipment must be reported immediately to the Director of Emergency Management or his/her representative.

User shall, at its own expense, maintain all User-owned subscriber equipment to ensure such equipment is in proper working order in accordance to manufacturer and MCICS specifications and cause all replacements, hardware or software upgrades or modifications, and repairs to be timely made. To ensure system integrity, User shall use only a factory-authorized radio service shop(s), approved by the Director of Emergency Management, to perform the maintenance, upgrading, modification, or repair of any equipment interfacing with the MCICS.

- Emergency Management shall maintain a list of approved subscriber equipment, required options and feature sets, and related peripheral accessories, and User agrees to use only approved equipment while accessing the MCICS. User shall not assign new subscriber equipment to the network or add an accessory to an MCICS radio unless the make, model, options, and feature sets of the equipment/accessory have been approved by the Director of Emergency Management. User may request that a particular radio or accessory be added to the list of approved equipment/accessories by providing the make and model number of the item as well as sufficient technical details to allow the Director of Emergency Management to determine if the equipment is compatible with the MCICS network and its critical operating features. User is advised that some MCICS feature sets (e.g. Advanced Digital Privacy encryption) may be proprietary to a particular vendor and may not properly interface with the MCICS. User is further advised that the use of unapproved equipment or accessories may adversely affect the MCICS system.
- 3.9 EQUIPMENT PROGRAMMING: The programming or reprogramming of any piece of radio equipment, including County-assigned equipment that interfaces with the MCICS must occur through the use of designated authorized programming vendors and/or technicians. The Director of Emergency Management, or his/her representative must approve in writing any programming or reprogramming to include the addition of non-MCICS licensed frequencies on such equipment, and such programming or reprogramming must be done by a County-approved vendor or technician.

3.10 RADIO IDENTIFIERS AND ALIASES: Radio identifiers and Aliases of any piece of radio equipment, including County-assigned equipment, County-provided data equipment, and User-owned equipment that interfaces with the MCICS must be assigned and approved by the Director of Emergency Management, or his/her representative.

Any movement/reassignment of any vehicle-installed equipment from one vehicle to another vehicle or re-numbering of vehicles must be reported to the Director of Emergency Management, or his/her representative prior to such movement/reassignment to insure continued integrity of the County's database of identifiers and Aliases.

- 3.12 SYSTEM FEATURES: User may request the Director of Emergency Management to make changes to feature sets and talk groups. The Director of Emergency Management, upon consultation with the County Fire Coordinator, County Emergency Medical Services Director, County Sheriff, E-911 Director, County Highway Superintendent, and/or IT Director will consider whether there is a demonstrated need for such change together with the potential impact of such on the network as a whole and for the other system subscribers. The Director of Emergency Management will have the final approval/disapproval of all proposed changes.
- 3.13 SYSTEM KEYS: The Director of Emergency Management may, at his or her discretion, make system keys available to User's vendor for purposes of accessing and changing radio programming settings. System keys shall remain the property of the County, and User shall return any system keys upon the request of the Director of Emergency Management. User or User's vendor shall not copy or transfer system keys to any entity without the prior written authorization of the Director of Emergency Management. Any transfer of system keys will be considered a breach of this agreement, resulting in the termination of the use of the MCICS.
- 3.14 SYSTEM USE: User agrees to use the MCICS and maintain its County-assigned, County-provided, and User-owned equipment in accordance with FCC rules and regulations and in accordance with MCICS policies and procedures. User agrees to use only those frequencies authorized by the County and further agrees to use the MCICS in a professional manner for official business purposes only. User shall attempt no repairs to County equipment unless authorized and shall not attempt to program or re-program equipment from the County or any source without the prior authorization of the Director of Emergency Management.
- 3.15 <u>INVENTORY REVIEW:</u> The Office of Emergency Management will conduct regular inventory reviews of equipment. User agrees to fully participate in inventory requests as conducted by the Office of Emergency Management.
- 3.16 <u>FAILURE TO COMPLY:</u> The Director of Emergency Management may, at his or her sole discretion, terminate User's IP address and remove the User-owned subscriber equipment from the MCICS for failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement; and reactivate User upon demonstration of compliance.

- 4. <u>LIABILITY</u>: In no event shall the County be liable to User or to any third party who acts in reliance on User for any damages resulting from this Agreement, including indirect, incidental, special or consequential. This limitation includes damages attributed to any malfunction of the MCICS system, regardless of the cause of action, arising out of or connection with a party's performance.
- 5. SYSTEM GOVERNANCE: The Board of Supervisors shall establish policies and procedures for access to MCICS and for the operation of the MCICS, which policies and procedures shall be adopted after consultation with the Director of Emergency Management, County Fire Coordinator, County Emergency Medical Services Director, County Sheriff, and/or the E-911 Director. The County agrees to make such policies and procedures available to User upon request. Users may request changes to the MCICS policies and procedures by submitting such request to the Director of Emergency Management, or his/her representative. Final approval of such changes remains with the Board of Supervisors.
- 6. ASSIGNMENT: User agrees that it shall not assign, transfer, and convey any radio equipment or frequency access without the prior express written consent of the Board of Supervisors.
- 7. STATUTORY COMPLIAMCE: In acceptance of this Agreement, User agrees to comply in all respects with all Federal, State, and County laws and regulations which pertain to the services provided herein.
- 8. APPROPRIATIONS: It is understood by and between the parties that this Agreement shall be deemed executory only to the extent of the monies appropriated and available for the purpose of this Agreement. No liability on account thereof shall be incurred by the County beyond funds appropriated and available for the purpose of this Agreement.
- 9. RETENTION OF RECORDS: User agrees to retain all records and other documents relevant to this Agreement for six (6) years after the termination of this Agreement, whichever later occurs. County, or any State and/or Federal auditors, and any other persons duly authorized by the County, shall have full access and the right to examine any of said materials during said period.
- 10. ACCEPTANCE OF SUBSTITUTED SERVICE: The User hereby consents and agrees to accept to substituted service of process via first class mail to the above referenced address of any summons, process or pleading pertaining to or arising from litigation concerning this agreement in lieu of any other methods authorized by the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. Service of process shall be deemed to be complete upon mailing same. This provision shall survive the termination of this agreement and shall not be construed requiring substituted service, should the County elect to commence litigation by other means provided for by law. The County does not waive personal service herein and will require service of process in conformity with CPLR§311(4).
- 11. <u>DISSOLUTION/CONSOLIDATION OF SERVICES</u>: Should the User dissolve under the provisions of state law and cease to exist as a municipal corporation, non-profit corporation or business corporation providing EMS or other services, any equipment provided by the County

shall revert to the ownership of Madison County and User agrees to return same to the Director of Emergency Management within thirty (30) days of dissolution. Should a User's agency be consolidated or dissolved, the User agrees to return any requested equipment to the Director of Emergency Management within thirty (30) days' of dissolution or consolidation.

- 12. PERSONAL USE PROHIBITED: The User understands and agrees that the equipment provided hereunder and the frequencies owned by the County are for Fire, EMS, and Police, Public Service and/or municipal use only. Inconsistent uses may constitute a breach of this agreement and may constitute a crime.
- 13. NO ARBITRATION: Any and all disputes involving this Agreement, including the breach or alleged breach thereof, may not be submitted to arbitration unless specifically agreed thereto in writing by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, but must instead only be heard in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, with venue in Madison County or, if appropriate, in the Federal District Court with venue in the Northern District of New York, Syracuse division.
- 14. GOVERNING LAW: This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York. User shall abide by all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations pertaining to the User's obligations hereunder for the duration of this agreement.
- 15. CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS: This Agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, whether written or oral. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by both parties, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement.
- 16. SEVERABILITY: If any term or provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and every other term and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 17. CLAUSES REQUIRED BY LAW: The parties to this Agreement understand and agree that each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Agreement shall be deemed to have been inserted herein. If through mistake or inadvertence, such provision is not inserted; such provision shall be deemed to have been inserted and shall have the full force and effect of law.
