Born in Tennessee and a proud resident of Madison County, New York for over 30 years, Julie Mosley is a dedicated Madison County Mental Health Crisis Worker with the Oneida City Police Department as a C.A.R.E Specialist (Crisis Assessment, Response, & Engagement). In this role, she provides compassionate, professional screening, assessment, and intervention for individuals experiencing mental health crises. Working in collaboration with law enforcement, clinical staff, and community service providers, Mosley helps ensure that individuals in crisis receive timely, appropriate support and connections to ongoing care, including follow-up with individuals referred to her by OPD members.

Mosley brings a strong foundation of experience from more than a decade in behavioral health and crisis intervention. Before joining the Oneida City Police Department, she served in roles at Pathways Wellness Center, including Recovery Center Coordinator and Peer Specialist. Additionally, she has worked with the Mobile Crisis Assessment Team (MCAT), providing on-call crisis response and de-escalation services throughout Madison County. Across these roles, Julie has developed a reputation for leadership, empathy, and an unwavering commitment to empowering individuals on their wellness and recovery journeys.

A New York State Certified Peer Specialist, Julie has completed specialized training in areas such as trauma-informed care, motivational interviewing, crisis intervention, and mental health first aid. This extensive training, combined with personal insight and professional experience, informs her holistic approach to crisis response and community wellness.

Outside of work, Julie enjoys tackling home DIY projects, attending music concerts, and spending quality time with her two sons.

PROPOSITION

Please take notice that on the back of your ballot this year is a proposition that reads:

"Shall Section 2.1 (A) of the Oneida City Charter be amended to abolish the elective position of the City Chamberlain?"

Currently, the City Chamberlain is an **elected** position. What this proposition will do, if voted Yes to (in favor of), will abolish the position and replace it with an Account Clerk position.

This affords the city the opportunity to hire a full-time employee who can be more responsive to the needs of the residents and allows the city to set a rigid schedule that is conducive to city operations and makes it easier for our residents to come in and pay bills.

The City of Oneida, Department of Public Works, will begin the annual Citywide cleanup on **Monday, October 20th, 2025**, and shall continue while weather permits. Please note that this will be the last Green Waste pickup for 2025.

DPW Staff will start in the Northern section of the city and work their way south as the week progresses. DPW Staff may reach areas earlier or later in the week, depending on weather conditions and the quantity of materials encountered.

FALL CLEANUP 101

Place loose leaf piles between the sidewalk and street for pickup. Do not place leaves in the roadway. Leaves in the road can become a traffic hazard and clog storm drains causing flooding.
Place only leaves in loose piles for pickup. Branches and non-yard waste material in piles could damage the leaf vacuum and injure crew members.
Do not place leaves around utility poles, trees or hydrants. Leaf piles located around above- ground structures slows down the crews. Leaves covering hydrants create an emergency response hazard and may cause injury to crews operating equipment.
Place Bags or Branches/Brush in separate pile from loose leaves.
"Inside District" residents do not need to call DPW or submit requests for pickup.
"Outside District" residents need to call 315-363-7222 to request their green waste pickup. DPW will be doing a pickup of "Outside District" by November 14th.
The City offers self-drop-off if residents do not want to wait for pick-up. Residents can drop-off gree waste at our site off of Route 5 (entrance next to Oneida Creek bridge) between the hours of 8:30AM 3PM Mon-Fri. No commercial green waste is allowed.


