ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

- The Assessor keeps a current record of the physical description (or inventory) and value estimate of every parcel. This is called the Property Assessment Roll. It is available to the public. That roll is given to the City Council and County legislature members. They use it to help develop an annual budget. That is why the goal of the Assessor is to make sure the market value of each property is fair, so that each taxpayer pays their fair share of the tax burden.
- Does the Assessor raise or lower your taxes? No! While you may often hear the job title of "Tax Assessor," there is no such position defined by New York State Law. Your elected officials who create and vote on budgets are responsible for tax rates and levies.

The BASIC Star Program is available for owner-occupied, primary residences with qualifying incomes.

The ENHANCED Star Program provides an increased benefit for the primary residences of senior citizens ages 65 and older with qualifying incomes.


Oneida's \$10 M Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) is moving forward! A specified portion of the funding, which comes from the NYS Homes & Community Renewal agency, will be used to repair and renovate existing structures within the DRI boundary area. The Business Assistance Fund (BAF) program kicked off last fall, with a public presentation at City Hall. Several applications have been approved, and owners are currently working with consultants to develop their individual projects. We expect to see activity on those sites later this year.

At this time, there is still some funding available for potential applicants. If you are interested in learning more about the BAF program, go to the City of Oneida website at oneidacityny.gov. The municipal projects that are being funded through the NYS Department of State are still waiting for official paperwork from Albany. Consultants have already been chosen, and we are ready to get started working on downtown infrastructure, the AYSO Soccer Fields, and the upgrades at Veteran's Field as soon as all of the documentation is completed.

HARBORING OF HENS

Several residents in the Inside District have requested a modification to the City Code to permit the harboring of hens. The Council has engaged with the community by listening to comments during open forums and conducting a Public Hearing to gather input. While a Local Law was initially proposed, the Council has opted to conduct further review in response to feedback from residents. It's important to clarify that any changes made will solely impact the Inside District, with no alterations planned for the Outside District at present.

On March 19, 2024, the Common Council voted to establish a special committee comprised of representatives chosen by each councilor. This committee will thoroughly examine the current proposed law and offer recommendations to Council. Subsequently, a revised Local Law will be introduced, followed by another Public Hearing. Stay tuned for updates!

City of Oneida to Receive \$1M Grant for Water Improvements



The City of Oneida will be the recipient of a federal grant to help pay for critical improvements to the Lake Street Pumping Station. The grant comes as part of a Congressionally Directed Spending package included in a recently passed appropriation bill. "The City wishes to thank Congressman Brandon Williams, along with Senators Gillibrand and Schumer for their support of our project in the 2023 CDS submittal" said Mayor Rick Rossi.

The total project cost for the improvements to the station is \$1.9 million. According to Mayor Rossi, this grant will help control Oneida water rates. Mayor Rossi stated, "without it the City would have to recover the entire cost of the pumping station project through what it charges its customers."

The Lake Street pumping station is a major component of the City's water supply system, helping to reliably move water to all portions of the City, especially higher elevations. Constructed in the 1970's to meet high water demands in summer and during emergencies, the system has aged over the years. Equipment in the station has deteriorated, and much of it has become obsolete. Only one of the three pumps in the station is presently operable, and there is no emergency power.

In addition to improving the reliability of the City water system, the improvements will incorporate modern energy efficient controls and motors that will reduce the City's carbotion project is part of the City's continuing investment to maintain a safe and reliable water system for city residents.

SOLID WASTE NEWS

At the February 20, 2024 Madison County Solid Waste Committee meeting, the committee continued to look at what is best for the future of the landfill, residents and employees. Cornerstone Engineering has started their work to evaluate what Madison County Solid Waste would need to be able to scale up operations on their own.

The Madison County Solid Waste Committee is still exploring the three viable long-term options - status quo; Madison County increasing tonnage and operations on their own; or partnering with either a public or a private entity to increase tonnage and operations. The next committee meeting will be held on March 26, 2024 and it is open to the public.
