

Madison County Officials Alert the Community to a Rise in Pertussis

Wampsville, NY – Madison County Public Health announced today it is seeing an increase in pertussis cases among school-aged children. Pertussis, also called whooping cough, is a bacterial respiratory infection that spreads easily to others when individuals with this infection cough or sneeze.

"Whooping cough can be very serious for infants too young to be vaccinated. This is why we are alerting both medical providers and the public that this illness is spreading in our community," said Madison County Public Health's Community Health Director, Rebecca LaPorte.

Infants, especially unvaccinated or incompletely vaccinated, are the most likely to have severe disease or have complications such as pauses in breathing, pneumonia, convulsions, disease affecting the brain, or death.

Vaccinated people who get pertussis most often have milder symptoms than would be expected in unvaccinated persons. The most common symptoms are cough, nasal congestion and fever. Cough can worsen and last several weeks.

Anyone who has symptoms consistent with pertussis should stay home and contact a health care provider for evaluation and testing. Early treatment with antibiotics is important for reducing the severity of symptoms, especially in infants. People diagnosed with pertussis should stay home from work or school until they have completed five days of antibiotic treatment to avoid spreading pertussis to others.

Routine vaccination against pertussis is recommended for all children and adults to prevent or lessen the severity of disease. The DTaP vaccine for children and Tdap vaccine for adults protect against pertussis as well as two other serious infections, tetanus and diphtheria. Tdap vaccination is also recommended for pregnant women during every pregnancy to protect their babies from whooping cough in the first few months of life.


Persons who live with someone diagnosed with pertussis should consult their healthcare provider to determine if they should also be treated.

FIRE SAFETY

Water real trees regularly, clean chimneys, use fireplace screens, and never leave fires unattended. Keep space heaters away from combustibles, and test smoke/CO detectors. Avoid overloading outlets, keep a fire extinguisher

HOME SAFETY

FOOD SAFETY

Wash your hands and surfaces often when preparing food. Cook food to the appropriate temperature, using a food thermometer to ensure it's safe to
