I was wondering if there could be better signage on ROUTE 5 for truckers to know to turn down Broad Street as that is where the HOOD factory entrance is. I have been behind several trucks as of late that do not know they have to turn down this seemingly side street to get to the factory. They instead go straight to the front of the the HOOD building where the entrance is blocked off (near McDonalds, and across from TROOP D). Then the truck has to get in the median lane with their flashers on. They would have to turn down Seneca Street and go by the school / a really residential area to turn themselves back around. It seems like there is absolutely no signage for all of these out of state truckers to know where their deliveries have to go.

Also, I live near 6th Street in Oneida Castle. There is a sign posted near the park by Oneida Castle School saying 'do not use trucking brakes, residential area' However, this sign should be up near 6th street as there is that final hill that trucks go down and this is when they all use their trucking brakes. By the time they reach the sign by the park they already used their brakes and it's less of a residential area at that point where as near 6th street there are still about 3 blocks of residents / houses where the brakes disturb residents.



The Traffic Safety Board for the City of Oneida met on July 18, 2023, and, among other matters, reviewed your concerns with the No Parking Signs around 302 Main Street.

To properly address your concerns, advisors and members of the Traffic Safety Board discussed the current signs near your business. Traffic Advisor Bob Anderson also clarified the signs and parking locations currently in the area. After much discussion about the varying signs that could be used to help citizens understand the parking restrictions around your business, the Traffic Safety Board voted unanimously to change the signs in the area. The "No Parking Between Signs" by the Dental Office will be replaced with new "No Parking Driveway" signs. The "No Standing At Any Time" sign will be replaced with a new "No Parking Here to Corner" sign.
